If Cruz has found all the pieces of the puzzle, he has the formula of a very special medicine.

The pieces of the puzzle are scattered all over the world and he can only find out where they are if he manages to solve complicated coded clues. He travels to all these places because he and his school are on a yacht, the Orion.

But finding these pieces is not that easy. The mysterious organization Nebula is after him and the puzzle pieces!




2: Summary

In this chapter I give a summary of The Tiger's Nest. This summary consists of six small summaries of 30-40 pages of the book.

Chapters 1-4 (pages 1-37)

Cruz has just returned to the Orion after visiting his father. Immediately afterwards he and Emmett are allowed to sail with the submarine of the Orion. This is a very special moment for Cruz, because the last time he was in this submarine, he almost got killed by someone from Nebula. Fortunately it went well this time.

It was Sunday, that meant Funday (Sunday + fun), something Taryn had invented to distract the students a bit from school. During Funday, Cruz and his group came up with a toy for




Hubbard, Taryn's dog. The dog can control it with his mind, but during the first tests it didn't work very well. He flew into the hallway, but luckily Taryn had caught the ball in time.

Also, Cruz and his best friends received the clue of the fifth puzzle piece: the code "NEMINARET 1129". He and his friends had no idea what Cruz's mother meant by this, but they didn't give up. The day after, Cruz received a mysterious message from an unknown person. It said: "There is a spy on board. The danger is closer than you think!".

Chapters 5-9 (pages 38-79)

The clue to the fifth puzzle piece was damaged. Fanchon, head the lab on the Orion, was able to recover this photo. They found out that his mother's diary, which contains a lot of classified information, is in the Archives of the Explorer Academy. And quite coincidentally, Emmett's father works there. Cruz didn't know this yet, because the Archives and the Synthesis are strictly classified by everyone, many people don't even know that it exists. Later that afternoon, Team Cousteau was called to the Cave (an augmented reality rehearsal room in the Orion). Team Cousteau is the group of explorers made up of Emmett, Lani, Sailor, Bryndis, Dugan and Cruz. In the Cave the hear that they have to do a mission to plant trees. But



they find this very boring, they had hoped for the mission with sea turtles.

When Team Cousteau goes on the mission, their teacher, Mr. Gabriel, suddenly disappeares. Later it turns out that he is hanging on a cliff. Because it is raining very hard and because their teacher is in a place that is difficult to reach, they don't know how to save him.


Chapters 10-13 (pages 80-113)

Yet they manage to find a way to save Mr. Gabriel. They tie the ropes of their parachutes together. They have just enough rope to make Lani climb down the cliff. She helps Mr. Gabriel to climb up, but then Lani has to go back up as well. Cruz had his robot bee Mell. The bee saw that Lani was gone. Everyone from Team Cousteau was very shocked. In the end, it turned out that Lani had taken a different route, because it took so long. Fortunately, she had not disappeared. After the mission, the explorers flew back to the Orion, where Aunt Marisol was proudly waiting for them.

That night, Lani had a solution to find the spy. They would send a message on behalf of

someone else saying that they found a piece of the puzzle. They would then hide and wait for someone (the spy) to come. In the end, the trap worked and it turned out to be Felipe, the boy in the room next to Cruz's! After that Cruz and his friends continued to solve his mother's clue to the puzzle piece. They found out they had to go to the Taj Mahal! When they got there, they immediately started looking, but unfortunately they couldn't find anything. They decided to go back the next day when suddenly a girl came up to Cruz. She was the one who sent the secret messages about the spy. She gets that information because her father is the boss of Nebula. The girl says that that people from Nebula are after him on his trip to the Taj Mahal.





Chapters 14-18 (pages 116-153)

When the girl walked away, Cruz quickly ran back to the Taj Mahal. He looked at everything again, and then he discovered something. There was a loose stone and when you move it a door opens. When he sees the entrance, he is very relieved, because he had expected that he would not find anything.

Cruz walks through the doorway and sees a staircase. It is a wooden staircase that creaked a little. When he had carefully walked down the stairs, he heard a bang; it was the door through which he had come in. Cruz was locked up!

Cruz saw something in the wall, it looked a bit like a window. He felt the "glass" to see if it might be a door. It turned out to be a kind of pudding. Suddenly a kind of hologram screen appeared. In the hologram he saw his hands with the word "match" above them. It later turned out to be a kind of

security that works through biometrics. That is also the technique used for facial recognition on a telephone, for example.

Finally, Cruz finds the fifth puzzle piece and goes with his friends to look at his mother's next clue about the sixth puzzle piece. This showed that they have to go to Bhutan!

Chapters 19-23 (pages 154-195)





3: The characters

In this chapter I describe the characters in The Tiger's Nest. I first give information about the main characters and then about the secondary characters.

Main characters

Cruz Coronado

Cruz is at the Explorer Academy, where a lot is expected of him. He's not afraid of doing dangerous things and Cruz isn't quick to give up either.

Cruz really enjoys the exploration classes at his school, especially because of the high-tech equipment they use there. An example of this is the Cave. Here you are in an augmented reality space while you perform those missions. Unfortunately, there is also less fun going on. Cruz is being followed by the mysterious organization called Nebula. They are after him because they don't want him to complete his mother's formula. Cruz and his friends search for the puzzle pieces his mother left for him years ago.



Lani Kealoha

Lani is Cruz's best friend from Hawaii, where they used to live. In the second year of the Explorer Academy, Lani entered Cruz's class. Lani upgraded Mell the robotbee so that Cruz can now control Mell with his voice. This is very handy, because in certain situations he can not control the bee with his hands.

Sailor York



Cruz's mother died in a mysterious accident. Nebula probably has something to do with this. She died when Cruz was only five years old.

Before her death, she left clues and codes all over the world about her

Marisol Coronado



Bryndis is just like Sailor, Emmett and Lani with Cruz in Team

Cousteau. Bryndis is from Iceland's capital, Reykjavik.

She's smart and patient, which is why she's a good member of Team Cousteau. She makes sure that everyone stays calm when something goes wrong, but at the same time she is also trying to find a good solution.

Cruz has a crush on Bryndis, but it seems she has less feelings for him.

Bryndis is much less in the story than the other members of Team Cousteau. This is because she is not involved in the search for Cruz's mother's puzzle pieces. Why she is not involved is unclear. But one reason could be that Cruz doesn't fully trust her.





Hubbard

Hubbard is a small dog, a West Highland Terrier. Hubbard is always happy and wants to play very often. The Planet Pup that Cruz and his friends made is for Hubbard. He understands how the special toy works and often plays with it.

Hubbard is very loved by the students on the Orion, but he prefers to play with Cruz. Hubbard wears a bright yellow life jacket on the Orion so that everyone recognizes him and he is safe on the boat.

Taryn is Hubbard's owner. After her death, Cruz decided to take care of him.

Dugan Marsh

Dugan is also on Team Cousteau. He is often grumpy and grumbles a lot with his classmates. Dugan is from Santa Fe, a city in New Mexico. Cruz doesn't like Dugan very much, because he often brags about things and because he is very competitive. That doesn't make it fun to play a competition or a game with him. Dugan often says that Cruz wasn't fairly hired at the Explorer Academy because his Aunt, Marisol Coronado, is a professor at the Academy. Like Bryndis, Dugan comes not often in the story. This is probably because Dugan is not really a friend of Cruz.





In this chapter I will tell you something about two quotes that I found in the book. I explain what the meanings of the quotes are and why I thought they were important.

I found the first quote in chapter 3, on page 28:

"Even when you have a talent or a passion for something you still have to learn the skills.

Also, no one expects you to be anything other than yourself."

This quote means that you should not assume that you will succeed the first time. If you really want to do something well, you have to practice it. And the more you practice, the better and faster you can do something. The quote also states that you do not have to behave or pretend to be different for others. Nobody thinks it is strange that you cannot do something right the first time.

I think this quote is important because you have to practice and learn things to be able to master something properly. I also think it's an important quote, because it should actually be that way in real life. I don't think you should be laughed at when something doesn't work right away.

The second quote was at the end of the story in chapter 23, on page 188:

"You can look back, but you can't go back."

This quote means something very different from the previous one. This means that you cannot reverse something. You may feel guilty about something that happened all the time, but it's not going to help. Even if it is very bad what happened. You have to realize that you cannot go back in time to prevent it or solve it.

I think this quote is important, because there are many people who feel very guilty about something. They are allowed to be sad, but I also just said, you can not reverse it.


5: Book cover illustration
